

**Gulf Coast Center Program of Projects (POP)
for Federally Funded Transit Service in Galveston and Brazoria Counties
FY 2017**

Connect Transit, the transportation department of the Gulf Coast Center (GCC), operates transit services in mainland Galveston and Brazoria Counties. The GCC receives annual funding from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), referred to as “Section 5307” funds, to support planning, capital, and operating costs associated with providing these transit services. The funds are designated for transit service in the Texas City/La Marque and Lake Jackson/Angleton Small Urbanized Areas (as designated by the U.S. Census).

The total amount of Section 5307 funds apportioned for each urbanized area for FY 2017 is as shown in *Table 1* below.

Lake Jackson/Angleton	\$1,076,665

Table 2 shows how the total amount of Section 5307 funds will be divided among planning, capital, operating, and design/engineering activities in each urbanized area for FY 2017.
